THE BALI MEMORIAL

A place for remembrance and reflection



The Bali Memorial is dedicated to Western Australians who died, or were injured, in the Bali terrorist attacks on 12 October 2002 and honours the courage and support provided by many individual volunteers and organisations following the incident.

A PLACE FOR REMEMBRANCE AND QUIET REFLECTION



Nestled into the Kings Park escarpment, the Bali Memorial is a place for remembrance and quiet reflection, with viewing platforms and gathering spaces provided in the design.

The two perspectives capture familiar qualities of Perth. The Swan River axis frames a view across the river to the Darling Range. The Sunrise axis is aligned so a ray of light enters the Memorial at sunrise on 12 October each year, illuminating the plaque engraved with the names of those Western Australians lost in the terrorist attacks.

The Premier Dr. Geoff Gallop decided to commission the Memorial, architects Donaldson + Warn created

the design following consultation with both families who lost loved ones and the public. Kimberley sandstone, steel and granite materials are used in its construction.

The Memorial features images of native flora and fauna on the steel walls, symbolising growth and renewal. Phrases of comfort and hope are etched into the walls and paving. Native plantings, including a grove of sixteen grass trees, reinforce the Memorial's Australian spirit.

The Pines Picnic area on the western side of Fraser Avenue was also refurbished as part of the Bali Memorial Project.

His Excellency Lieutenant General John Sanderson AC, Governor of Western Australia, officially dedicated the Bali Memorial on 12 October 2003.
