

WA BOTANIC GARDEN FAVOURITES

The Kings Park team have chosen some of their favourite eye-catching and resilient plants. Can you find these eight WA Botanic Garden Favourites hidden in Rio Tinto Naturescape Kings Park?

Heart-leaf Flame Pea
Chorizema cordatum

Abundant orange, red and yellow pea flowers in spring. Evergreen shrub with heart-shaped leaves.



Illyarrie
Eucalyptus erythrocorys

Bright red flower caps cover yellow flowers in late summer. With creamy-coloured bark and large woody fruit.



Ashby's Banksia 'Dwarf'
Banksia ashbyi subsp. *boreoscaia*

A dense, low rounded shrub. It's showy orange blooms provide nectar for native animals.



Pin-cushion Hakea
Hakea laurina

Small, dense tree with cream and pink pin-cushion like flowers. Attracts nectar-feeding small birds.

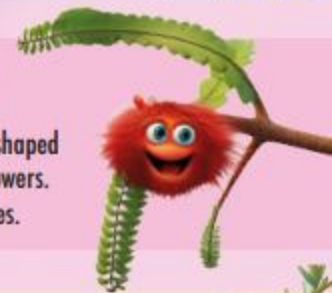
Book-leaf Mallee
Eucalyptus kruseana
Decorative round and grey overlapping leaves. Small clusters of yellow flowers in winter/spring.



Plumed Featherflower
Verticordia plumosa
Tiny, blue-green leaves contrast with feathery pink-purple flowers. Grows well in pots.



Kalbarri Beaufortia
Beaufortia aestivalis
Low, dense shrub with oval-shaped leaves and brush-like red flowers. A favourite for birds and bees.



Wax Flower
Chamelaucium ciliatum
Small shrub with distinctive fruity aroma. Densely covered in small white/pink/purple flowers during spring.
